Trend Tables: The Chartbook is followed by 134 Trend Tables organized around four major subject areas: health status and determinants, health care utilization, health care resources, and health care expenditures. The tables present data for additional years of data may be available in Excel spreadsheet files on the **Health, United States** website. Trend Tables for which additional data years are available are listed in Appendix III.
